Composer's Notes:

Psalm 66 appears twice in the Sunday lectionary (20th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A, and 6th Sunday of Easter, Year C) and also as a psalm for Morning and Evening Prayer in the Divine Office. It is also ideal as a common psalm for Ordinary Time and Easter, and with its eschatological references, Advent too. This setting, with its strong march-like refrain, could also be used as a gathering hymn.
